Activity Fee

(paid at time of registration)
\$145 (* KIA's \$175)

Payments

Tuition will be collected in 3 payments.
All three checks must be turned in on the first day of camp. The checks should be dated:
May 27th, 2008
June 23th, 2008
July 21st, 2008

The formula for determining the amount due is:
Weekly tuition (\$145) X 11 weeks of camp
Divided by 3 payments

Tuition

\$145/week
\$145 X 11 weeks = \$1595
\$1595 divided by 3 payments = \$532 per payment

- Each additional sibling receives a 10% discount. Please verify the amount to Sue Beuscher 266-4100.
- KIA = group 4 (ages 10-11)
- If you have a child enrolled in the day school and already make weekly payments, you may pay weekly.

- Full-time camp activities from May 27th to August 8th, 2008 for children ages 4 - 12 (by October 1st, 2008).
- Time available each day is 7:15-5:45. Children need to arrive no later than 9:00 a.m. and must be picked up no later than 5:45.
- Daily activities that expand young minds, increase physical potential, and encourage sensitivity to God through:
 - daily chapel & prayer times
 - playground & gym times
 - pools
 - group-building activities
 - camp-wide competition/picnics
 - movie theatres
 - community service outings
 - weekly Biblical theme & lessons
 - a week of Centenary's Daily Vacation Bible School
- 5th-6th grade children (K.I.A.'s: Kids In Action) will have additional trips and activities published by May 1st.
- 2 experienced counselors per classroom of 16 children. All counselors have an extensive application process and fulfill all teaching requirements for the Kentucky license for the Centenary Early Childhood Center

What to have each day at camp:

(these may be left at camp during the week)
A labeled bag with (all labeled items)

- water bottle
- sunscreen
- Bible
- sports shoes
- change of clothes
- one piece swimsuit and towel
- healthy lunch that does not require heating

What not to bring:

Electronic devices, flip flops, immodest clothes, clothes promoting questionable or suggestive material.

Discipline Strategies:

Redirection and Cool-Out times will be our primary form of guidance as well as reinforcing the positive and showing love through understanding.

If negative behaviors create an unsafe or inappropriate environment for other campers or staff, the parent or guardian will be called. If a parent receives three disciplinary calls, then the camper will be asked to leave camp for the rest of the summer.
